**■ Deputy T. Dempsey:** □ **٩** I am reminded of a teacher I had in Enniscorthy CBS many years ago called ++

**• Deputy Mulcahy:**  $\Box \blacksquare$  I welcome the group, although unfortunately I was not able to be here for the +++

**Mr. Horgan:** Chairman, may I reply?

E Chairman: Q Mr. Horgan can do so in a general reply.

**Horgan:** It is an important point. One of the group's members is currently before +

**• Deputy Mulcahy:**  $\bigcirc \P$  I was just setting out a statement of principle and was not referring to +++++++

**Deputy Durkan:** Q **A** Like other speakers, I have friends and close relatives in the US. I would like ++

**Deputy M. Higgins: D a** In respect of the anti-conscription league?

**Deputy Durkan:**  $\bigcirc$  **Q** It was not that far back, though the person I speak of would have gone back ++++++++++

**E** Chairman:  $\Box \square$  We have had an extensive discussion on the matters that we came here to address. ++++

**E Senator Mooney:**  $\bigcirc$  **Q** That he could not get the numbers in Congress might be a more realistic +

**E** Chairman:  $\bigcirc \bigcirc$  There are also hopeful signs in Iraq after the recent elections; it is another +

**Deputy M. Higgins:**  $\square$  **I** twas very depressing, since the situation has worsened.

**E** Chairman:  $\Box \subseteq$  Yes, that is currently so. Some of the discussions were very depressing and +

■ Mr. Horgan: I express our sincere thanks. If we did not feel this committee is genuine, we +++

E Senator Mulcahy: O A Who said that? I would like to know.

**E** Chairman:  $\Box \square$  Perhaps Mr. Horgan might stick to the factual questions raised and make his own +

■ Mr. Horgan: Fine. With regard to Deputy Allen's point on the UN, it has been a common +

**E Senator Mooney:**  $\bigcirc$  **Q** I do not think they did. With respect, Mr. Horgan has been making that point +

**\blacksquare Chairman:**  $\Box \blacksquare$  It is now on the record.

**• Deputy M. Higgins:**  $\bigcirc$  **•** Yes, the issue is whether one can retrospectively pass a resolution, for +

**Mr. Horgan:** The issues of the Hague Convention were raised, in particular—

**Deputy M. Higgins:**  $\bigcirc$  **Q** The issues of law and interpretation are worthy of investigation.

**E** Chairman:  $\Box \square$  We could go back and debate every issue, as Mr. Horgan can see. Are there any +

■ Mr. Horgan: The issues of neutrality and the Hague Convention were raised. It was suggested ++

**Deputy Mulcahy:**  $\bigcirc$  **4** I have a brief supplementary question on this for the group.

If the UN +

■ Mr. Horgan: Yes, in the same way that Switzerland would oppose the landing of US military +

**\blacksquare** Deputy Mulcahy:  $\bigcirc$   $\bigcirc$  That is the point of departure. On the one hand we have always lodged our +

■ Mr. Horgan: That was so except in March 2003, when we walked right over the UN umbrella.

E Chairman: Q Can we leave that for the moment as a matter of disagreement?

**Deputy Mulcahy: O A** Yes, but it is important to note it.

 $\blacksquare$  Chairman:  $\bigcirc$   $\blacksquare$  Let us note it and we can discuss it again.

**Deputy M. Higgins:**  $\Box \triangleleft$  It is a matter of whether we are in compliance with the United Nations Charter. +

**E Senator Mooney:**  $\bigcirc$  **Q** Following on what Deputy Michael D. Higgins has said and because of the +

 $\blacksquare$  Mr. Horgan: We will try to be brief. The specific issues raised concerned US planes being ++

**E** Chairman:  $\Box \square$  Mr. Horgan has made that point. Perhaps he can go on to the next one.

■ Mr. Horgan: The situation in Iraq is grievously serious. We, the people of Ireland, as +

■ Chairman: □ We are way over time, so I am afraid we will have to bring matters to a close.

■ Mr. Hourigan: I will try to be as brief as possible. Some questions were directed +++++++++
