Name: Special Services Committee What is its mandate: The tasks of the Commission are concentrated on assessing legal and normative acts (bills and regulations) of general character concerning the special services, along with giving opinions on the directions of their work. The Commission gives opinions on the directions of the activity of the special services, basing on the information presented by the heads of these services, examines the annual reports of the heads of the ABW (Home Security Agency), AW (Intelligence Agency) and WSI (Military Intelligence Services) and it gives opinions on the requests concerning the appointment of particular persons as heads and deputy heads of the special services. MPs involved: The Special Services Committee was set up in 1995. The Committee (from 3.11.2005) is composed of 9 MPs: Marek BIERNACKI (PO), Roman GIERTYCH (LPR), Paweł GRAS (PO), Andrzej GRZESIK(Samoobrona -

Selfdefence) JEDRYCH Jedrzej (PiS), Zbigniew SOSNOWSKI (PSL), OPIOŁA Marek (PIS), Waldemar WIAZOWSKI (PIS) and Jerzy SZMAJDZIŃSKI (SLD). The chairman of the Committee is Roman GIERTYCH.
