






BACKGROUND

The EU has a strong partnership with the Nigerien government, aiming to strengthen State capacities, enhance security, stability and migration management, and promote long-term sustainable and inclusive development through a comprehensive and integrated approach, in line with the EU Strategy in the Sahel. Following a request by the European Council (June 2021), the Commission, together with the EEAS, has discussed with the Council an Action Plan on Niger in the area of migration, which was followed by the preparation of an action fiche, both framing the operationalisation of the Pact on Migration's external dimension with that country.
