Subject:	Road Map for the follow-up to the conclusions of the European Council in Seville - Combating illegal immigration, integrated management of external borders, integration of immigration policy into the Union's relations with third countries and speeding up of legislative work in framing a common policy on asylum and immigration.

- 1. The European Council in Seville, on 21-22 June 2002, decided to speed up the implementation of all aspects of the programme adopted in Tampere for the creation of an area of freedom, security and justice in the European Union. It pointed out the need to develop a European Union common policy on the separate, but closely related, issues of asylum and immigration. The conclusions list a number of measures to be taken (points 26-39) in this field.
- In order to fulfil the above requirement by the Seville Council the Danish Presidency after consultation with the Commission and the General Secretariat initiated a Road Map of all work on border control, immigration, asylum and co-operation with third countries in these fields (doc. 10525/3/2 JAI 152 ASILE 35 MIGR 63 FRONT 64 VISA 107 REV3).

- 3. The Greek Presidency following the requirement of Seville, especially its "calling on forthcoming Presidencies to continue giving migration issues a special place in the work schedules" and in line with its programme on Immigration, Integrated management of external Borders and Asylum, (doc. 5672/03 JAI 18) has continued keeping and updating a Roadmap, in co-operation with the Council Secretariat and the Commission, in order to monitor the progress of practical implementation of all issues related to the above themes. Special emphasis has been placed in fulfilling the other requirement in the same paragraph (28 of Seville) "to strike a fair balance between integration policy, asylum policy and resolute action to combat illegal immigration and trafficking in human beings".
- 4. The Greek Presidency will submit an overall Final Report at the European Council of Thessaloniki (June 2003).
- 5. Coreper will maintain overall responsibility for implementing the Road Map in accordance with Article 207 of the Treaty.
