## **Condensed Notice for Air Travellers**

Under US law, US Customs and Border Protection (CPB) will receive certain travel and reservation information about all passengers flying between the European Union and the US.

CBP will receive Passenger Name Record (PNR data) from airlines, including information provided during the booking process or held by airlines or travel agents.

HOW TO REACH US

- CBP has undertaken that it uses PNR data for the purposes of preventing terrorism and other transnational serious crimes.
- The information will be retained for at least three years and six months.
- It may be shared with other authorities.

These arrangements include measures to safeguard your personal data, including the right to request a copy of your PNR data held in CPB databases and to make corrections.
