Hundreds of groups and individuals around ternatio the world have been placed upon various gov "terrorist lists" and subject to the freezing of their assets, travel bans and other serious sanctions. Yet despite the gravity of the Name to accusations and the impact of their A.k.a.: A designation upon fundamental rights, affected a Liste parties have been systematically denied the right to mount a meaningful challenge to their inclusion on the lists.

ka.: a Seen largely as a "due process" question in 2000 Europe and North America, the "terrorism lists" have also had a significant impact on Diaspora communities, conflict resolution, c) G development work and North-South relations.

Many in the legal community, including the EU Courts and UN Human Rights Committee, have taken a dim view as to the legality or $^{7.65}_{ ext{c}}$ impact of these regimes. Some governments a Address stablish have recently proclaimed an end to the "war other on terror", but there is apparently little political appetite for meaningful reform or repeal of the Lkain "terrorism lists" or related executive powers -areas like "preventative" or security detention, QE.Y.67.1 "control orders" and "no-fly"lists.

This conference, organised by the European RE.R. 100 Centre for Constitutional Rights and the Law Faculty of the Université Libre de Bruxelles lartyrs (ULB, Free University of Brussels), brings together a distinguished group of expert practitioners, lawyers, academics and human A k.a. a rights organisations to examine these issues and consider possible ways forward.
