Objective/Description	At-sea operational exercises greatly assist the integration of EMSA's resources within the response mechanisms of Member States. The objective of the at-sea oil pollution response exercises is to practice mutual co-operation in responding to a large-scale oil pollution incident. For that purpose, the established co-operation agreements at Sub-regional (e.g. POLGER), Regional (e.g. HELCOM) and/or European level (e.g. MIC/EMSA) for combating marine oil pollution are implemented by the organising State.
	During the exercises, the operational coordination of the response units from different Member States and EMSA is put under the command of the State where the response operations are taking place. The use of oil spill response equipment in practice and in real sea conditions is exercised.
	The mobilisation procedures to request EMSA assistance by the affected State through the Civil Protection Mechanism (MIC) are also tested.
