Subject:	Summary of discussions

1. Programme of the Presidency

The **Chair** presented the programme of the Presidency for the first term of 2013, the main features of which were already outlined in the HLWG meeting of 26-27 November 2012 (see 17309/12 JAI 873 ASIM 150).

2. Implementation of the Global Approach

The **Commission representative** presented the state-of-play of dialogues and processes under the Global Approach. The GAMM update is set out in Annex I to this Note.

In this framework, specific information was provided on the following items:

 by CY, the Commission and EEAS representatives, on the outcome of the VII EU-CELAC High Level Meeting on Migration, held on 28 November in Brussels. In this framework, the EEAS representative also provided information on the preparations, in relation in particular to migration-related issues, for the EU-CELAC Summit, held on 26-27 January 2013 in Santiago de Chile.

- By **CY** and the **Commission representative**, on the outcome of the Mission to Amman, held on 12 December 2012, which launched a dialogue on Migration, Mobility and Security EU-Jordan.
 - The **Chair** provided information on the outcome of the Justice and Home Affairs Informal meeting, held on 15 January, in Dublin, which addressed the situation in Syria. In this context, the **Commission representative** provided information on the launch of a 'regional development and protection programme for refugees and host communities in the Middle East'. The programme consists of two main components: 1) an 'Operational research component' and 2) a 'Regional Protection Programme (RPP)' component. The 'Operational Research' component aims to establish 'robust evidencebase on the costs as well as the positive developmental and socio-economic impacts of refugees on host communities and countries. Therefore, this component encompasses micro- and macro-level studies, assessments and analyses will be conducted on the costs and impacts of refugees on: public and social services (e.g. health, education); demand, consumption and production of goods; and key sectors of the economy such as domestic labour markets, employment, livelihoods, land and property. In addition, assessments and analyses of current protection capacities, standards and rights provision for refugees will be conducted in partner countries. This key component is defined as 'operational' because the analytical research will be translated into practice. Indeed, it will inform the design and implementation of the socio-economic development activities for both refugees and host communities. In addition, the research findings will serve as the basis for advocacy and political dialogue with concerned governments and local authorities with regard to durable solutions and refugee mobility. In reference to the second component, the implementation of a Regional Protection Programme (RPP) will be an integral part of the broader development programme. The RPP specific content will be designed in line with the 2005 European Commission Communication on RPPs. The RPP will envisage core activities such as: legal assistance to refugees, the establishment of an effective Refugee Status Determination, the improvement of refugee reception conditions, refugee registration, capacity-building for national and local governmental authorities as well as project for host communities. Besides, the programme might explore the scope for a resettlement scheme notably to the EU Member States.

The **Commission representative** provided information on the state-of-play of the preparations for the first GAMM report, following the GAMM Communication of November 2011, expected to be issued in Spring/Summer 2013.

4. Azerbaijan

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The **Commission representative** provided information on the state-of-play of the contacts with the Azerbaijani authorities in view of the future establishment of a Mobility Partnership with this country.

The **Group** had an exchange of views on this subject.

5. Cooperation on migration with ASEAN

The **Commission** and **EEAS representatives** provided information on plans for developing cooperation on migration with ASEAN.

The **Group** had an exchange of views on this subject.

The **Chair** indicated that this item will be further addressed at the next HLWG meeting.

6. Budapest process Ministerial Meeting "A Silk Routes Partnership for Migration"

HU and the **Commission representative** provided information on the state-of-play of the preparations of the Ministerial Conference on the Silk Route, to be held on 19 April 2013 in Istanbul, including on the outcome of the meeting held on 10-11 December 2012 in Ankara.

The **Group** had an exchange of views on this subject and in particular on the definition of an EU position in view of the Ministerial Conference.

Underlining that it constitutes one of the priorities of its work programme, the **Chair** indicated that this item will be further addressed at the next HLWG meeting.

7. Dialogue on Migration EU-India

The **Group** pursued its discussions on the question of the possible establishment of a CAMM with India, which was already addressed at the HLWG meeting on 26-27 November 2012.

The **Chair** indicated that this item will be further addressed at the next HLWG meeting.

8. Situation in the Southern Mediterranean Region

The **Chair** and the **Commission representative** provided information on the state-of-play of the dialogue on Migration, Mobility and Security with Morocco and Tunisia, in particular on the preparations for the second negotiating meeting with Morocco, to be held on 14-15 February 2013 in Rabat.

The **Chair** indicated that this item will be further addressed at the next HLWG meeting.

GAMM UPDATE

18 January 2013

This document provides an updated overview of the main external migration dialogue processes implemented in the framework of the EU Global Approach to Migration and Mobility (GAMM). The document is compiled for the information of the EU High Level Working Group on Migration and Asylum by the responsible European Commission services, in association with the EEAS.

Part 1- The Regional Processes

(A) THE PRAGUE PROCESS

The Prague Process is a framework for dialogue and cooperation between the EU and its Member States, the non-EU Schengen States and 19 partner countries to the east (Russia, Eastern Partnership countries, Central Asian countries, Western Balkan countries, Turkey).

The work of the Prague Process is based on the Joint Ministerial Declaration (Prague 2009) and the Action Plan 2012-2016, adopted at the second Ministerial Conference of the Prague Process (Poznan, 2011).

(C) THE MME PARTNERSHIP

The Africa-EU Migration, Mobility and Employment (MME) Partnership was launched during the 2nd Africa-EU Summit of Heads of State and Government in December 2007 in Lisbon, where the Joint EU-Africa Strategy and the First Action Plan (2008-2010) were adopted. The partnership provides the framework for dialogue and cooperation on migration issues between the EU and all African States.

A second Action Plan (2011-2013) was adopted at the third Africa-EU Summit that took place in Tripoli on 29-30 November 2010. Implementation was interrupted in 2011 due to force majeure (situation in Libya, the African co-chair of the Partnership).

The process aims to enhance dialogue and cooperation between countries of origin, transit and destination along the West African migration route. A second Ministerial meeting took place in 2008 in Paris. The third one was held in Dakar in November 2011, where the Strategy for 2012-2014 was adopted.

(E) THE BUDAPEST PROCESS

The Budapest Process was initiated in 1991 as a consultative forum, currently containing of more than 50 governments and 10 international organizations, aiming at developing comprehensive and sustainable systems for orderly migration. The process focuses on three priority regions: the South-East European Region, the Black Sea Region and the Silk Routes Region. The GAMM Council Conclusions of May 2012 make specific reference to the latter.

(F) THE ACP-EU MIGRATION DIALOGUE

The ACP-EU Migration Dialogue was launched in June 2010 through a Joint Declaration of the ACP-EU Joint Council. The dialogue is based on Article 13 of the Cotonou Agreement. In May 2011 it was decided to further deepen the dialogue, focusing in particular on the subjects of remittances, visa and readmission, with the specific aim to strengthen the operational aspects of ACP-EU cooperation on these topics.

A series of expert meetings took place to this effect, both at expert and Senior Official / Ambassador level, in view of reporting back to the ACP-EU Joint Council of 2012. A joint report including recommendations on remittances, visas and readmission has been adopted in June 2012 at the ACP-EU Joint Council of Vanuatu.

In July 2010, the EU and Armenia launched negotiations on a future EU-Armenia Association Agreement to succeed the PCA. An EU migration mission visited Armenia in 2008. A Mobility Partnership was signed on 27 October 2011.

On 19 December 2011 Council adopted negotiating directives for the EU-Armenia agreements on visa facilitation and readmission and authorised the Commission to start negotiations. Negotiations started in February 2012 and were closed at the technical level in July 2012, after three rounds of negotiation.

Republic of Moldova

The Partnership and Cooperation Agreement (PCA) with Moldova went into force in 1994. Negotiations on the Association Agreement to succeed the PCA were launched on 12 January 2010. The EU-Moldova visa facilitation and readmission agreements entered into force in January 2008. A Mobility Partnership was signed in June 2008.

In June 2010 a visa dialogue was opened, examining conditions for visa-free travel of Moldovan citizens to the EU. The Action Plan on Visa Liberalisation was endorsed by the Council on 16 December 2010 and subsequently presented by the Commission to the Moldovan authorities on 24 January 2011.

The first progress report on the implementation by Moldova of the Visa Liberalisation Action Plan (VLAP) was presented on 16 September 2011. The Second Progress Report was issued on 9 February 2012. The third report was adopted on 22 June 2012. On 3rd of August the Commission has sent the report to the European Parliament and the Council on possible migratory and security impacts of future visa liberalisation for the Republic of Moldova on the EU. The second phase of the visa dialogue was launched on 19 November 2012. Assessment of the second phase will take place in February 2013, and the logic of the assessment system and the expectations of Member States will require the preparation of probably two progress reports in the course of 2013, if possible before the Vilnius EaP Summit of 29 November 2013.

Negotiations on the AA were finalized in 2011. The Readmission and Visa Facilitation agreements were concluded in 2008. An EU migration mission visited Ukraine in September 2010.

In 2008 a visa dialogue was opened, examining conditions for visa-free travel of Ukrainian citizens to the EU. The Action Plan on Visa Liberalisation was endorsed by the Council on 10 November 2010 and presented by the EU to Ukraine at the EU-Ukraine Summit on 22 November 2010. The First Progress Report on the implantation of the Action Plan was issued by Commission services and EEAS in September 2011 and the 2nd Progress Report on 9 February 2012.

Belarus

An EU migration mission visited Belarus in 2009. On 28 February 2011 the Council authorized the Commission to open negotiations on visa facilitation and readmission agreements with Belarus. The Commission submitted a formal invitation to the Belarusian authorities in June 2011 and reiterated several times (e.g. through Council Conclusions in March and October 2012) its readiness to launch negotiations for visa facilitation and readmission agreements which would enhance people-to-people contacts to the benefit of the Belarusian population at large. So far the Belarusian authorities have not answered the invitation of June 2011 to start negotiations.

The EU continues to impose travel restrictions on Belarusian officials and companies linked to the regime in reaction to the deterioration of the country's record on human rights, democracy and rule of law.

The European Dialogue on Modernization (DoM) with Belarusian Society was launched in March 2012

(D) <u>RUSSIA</u>

Russia

The EU-Russia Partnership and Cooperation Agreement (PCA) came into force in 1997. Ministerial meetings for Freedom, Security and Justice area (PPC) are organized regularly. New comprehensive EU-Russia Agreement is under negotiations.

The Visa Facilitation and Readmission Agreements entered into force on 1 June 2007. Joint Committees under both agreements are held twice a year. On 11April the Council adopted the mandate for the renegotiation of the Visa Facilitation Agreement but the negotiations are still ongoing (the last outstanding issue is the visa waiver for service passport holders).

The Visa dialogue was launched in 2007 and in this context, on 15 December 2011, the Parties agreed on a list of Common Steps which would need to be implemented before the talks on EU-Russia visa waiver might be launched. Senior Officials are monitoring the progress of the Dialogue during regular meetings (SOM).

In May 2011 Russia and EU launched a Dialogue on Migration and agreed the parameters of this new cooperation format. The Dialogue will focus on legal migration, migration and development, asylum and other forms of international protection, as well as on combating illegal migration and trafficking in human beings.

To better steer the dialogue and set out clear priorities, the EU and Russia endorsed the Work Plan for the EU-Russia Dialogue on Migration 2011-2012 at the Russia-EU Permanent Partnership Council on Freedom, Security and Justice on 10-11 October 2011 in Warsaw and the Work Plan for the EU-Russia Dialogue on Migration 2013-2014 at the Russia-EU Permanent Partnership Council on Freedom, Security and Justice on 3 October 2012 in Nicosia.

(F) ASIAN COUNTRIES

China

The EU-China comprehensive strategic partnership came into force in 2003. China signed an Approved Destination Status (ADS) Agreement in 2004, facilitating the entry of Chinese tourists into EU Member States and including provisions on readmission. Formal negotiation of an EU readmission agreement, based on 2002 negotiating directives, has not started yet. Negotiation of a Partnership and Cooperation Agreement, including an article on readmission and visa cooperation, started in 2007.

At the 14th EU-China Summit in February 2012 both sides agreed to explore the possibilities of facilitating mobility for Chinese and EU citizens, and strengthen cooperation on illegal immigration, as well as to pay special attention to the question of mutual visa exemption for holders of diplomatic passports. The 15th EU-China Summit reiterated these objectives, while calling for the launch an EU-China High Level Dialogue on Migration and Mobility.

The EU-India Co-operation Agreement (CA) entered into force in 1994. In 2004 the EU and India entered into a Strategic Partnership. The EU-India Joint Action Plan was agreed in 2005 at the Summit in The Hague and revised in 2008 at the eighth EU-India Summit in Marseille. This plan aims to promote among others people-to-people contacts and cultural exchanges. After the first EU-India migration dialogue meeting held in 2006, the December 2010 EU-India Summit emphasised the importance of movement of people, and agreed to deepen cooperation by establishing a regular, comprehensive and structured dialogue on migration issues.

The 12th EU-India Summit discussed possible ways to facilitate mobility – a recurring Indian request – in parallel with preventing and combating irregular migration.

(G) UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

USA

Relations between EU and the US have been formalized in 1990, in the Transatlantic Declaration, and further developed in the New Transatlantic Agenda which outlined a new framework for cooperation including a number of areas for joint action. An EU-US Joint Statement endorsed by the EU-US JHA Ministerial Troika in October 2009 (the so-called "Washington Statement") sets out common values and foundations of EU-US cooperation in the JHA area until 2014 and includes a commitment to enhance both political and operational cooperation in various JHA issues.

Further to this commitment cooperation has been developed on migration and asylum issues in the context of the <u>EU-US Cooperation Platform on Migration and Refugee issues</u>, launched in 2010. Activities include areas such as unaccompanied minors, biometrics, refugee resettlement, trafficking in human beings, development of capacity building for migration management in third countries and contribution of the Diaspora to the development of countries of origin of migration. **Recent and upcoming events**

The purpose of the HLD is to discuss the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development in order to identify appropriate ways and means to maximise its development benefits and minimise its negative impacts. In addition to a plenary debate, the HLD brings ministers and delegates together in informal round table discussions on themes such as the costs and benefits of migration, human rights of migrants, mainstreaming of migration issues in development planning and promoting intra-regional labour mobility.

The first HLD was held on 14-15 September 2006.
