(Consultation procedure)

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the initiative of the Kingdom of Sweden and the Kingdom of Spain (11419/2009)¹,
 - having regard to Article 39(1) and Article 34(2)(c) of the EU Treaty, pursuant to which the Council consulted Parliament (C7-0100//2009),
 - having regard to Rules 100 and 55 of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs (A7-0071/2009),
- A. Whereas the draft initiative of the Kingdom of Sweden and the Kingdom of Spain (11419/2009) raises issues in terms of the correct legal basis;
1. Rejects the initiative of the Kingdom of Sweden and the Kingdom of Spain (11419/2009);
 2. Calls on the Kingdom of Sweden and the Kingdom of Spain to withdraw their initiative;
 3. Instructs its President to forward its position to the Council and the Commission, and to the governments of the Kingdom of Sweden and the Kingdom of Spain.
