Session Aim: Clarify the case study and the group assignment, and facilitate groups to come up with findings on the case study.

Training environment and facilities

Contact classroom for 20 learners.

At the beginning of the session the learners are sat in an U-shape.

There should be one large space in order to create the possibility to split the group into 3 smaller table groups to allow for comfortable and independent group work and scenario-based learning.

Duration of the session

1 x 45 min.

Description of learning activities and the time for each activity

Introduction to the practical exercise - '15

Trainer explains the objective of the session, tasks and gives a short description of the scenarios and the work methodology.



Class is divided into 3 groups (A, B, C) of 6-7 learners each.

Each group is given a separate scenario and the package of relevant key reading materials. Each group is requested to nominate a group spokespersons to present the results and overall findings.

Case scenario for group A:

 A TCN apprehended by Croatian border guards (HRV) after illegally crossing the border coming directly from the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina (BIH).

Case scenario for group B:

 A TCN apprehended in Hungary (HUN) and subject to a return decision. A TCN claims to be from Ukraine (UKR)

Case scenario for group C:

• A TCN from Albania (ALB) was apprehended in The Hague, The Netherlands (NLD) based on suspicion of being involved in cigarette smuggling.

The task is to:

- 1. To describe the procedure to be followed by filling in the blank spaces in the sentence with a missing word or words;
- 2. To list at least 3 legal acts relevant for the case;
- 3. To list at least 5 fundamental rights and procedural safeguards to be observed in the particular case;
- 4. To list at least 2 main roles of designated stakeholder (each group has a different one);
- 5. To designate at least one message to take away from the exercise

Trainees are given 30 minutes to for group preparations.

- Group work - '30

Learners actively participate in group work based on the presentation of a task.

Learner Support and Feedback to learners

Opportunity for individual questions during the group work exercise.

Trainer facilitate and guide the work of each group to come up with findings.
