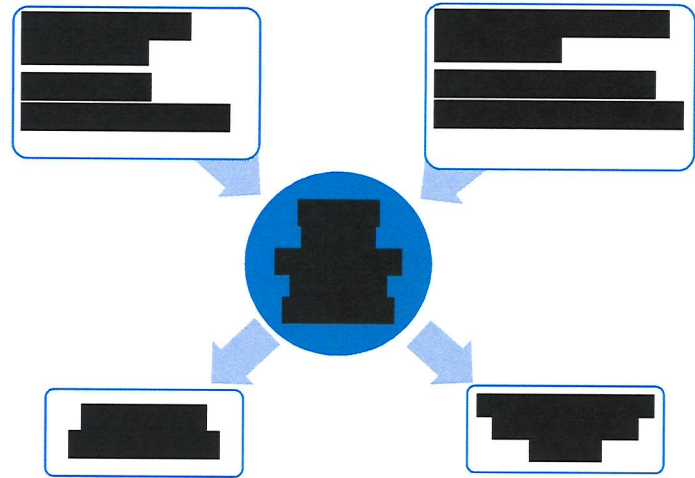
Operational Risk Analysis:

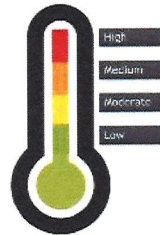

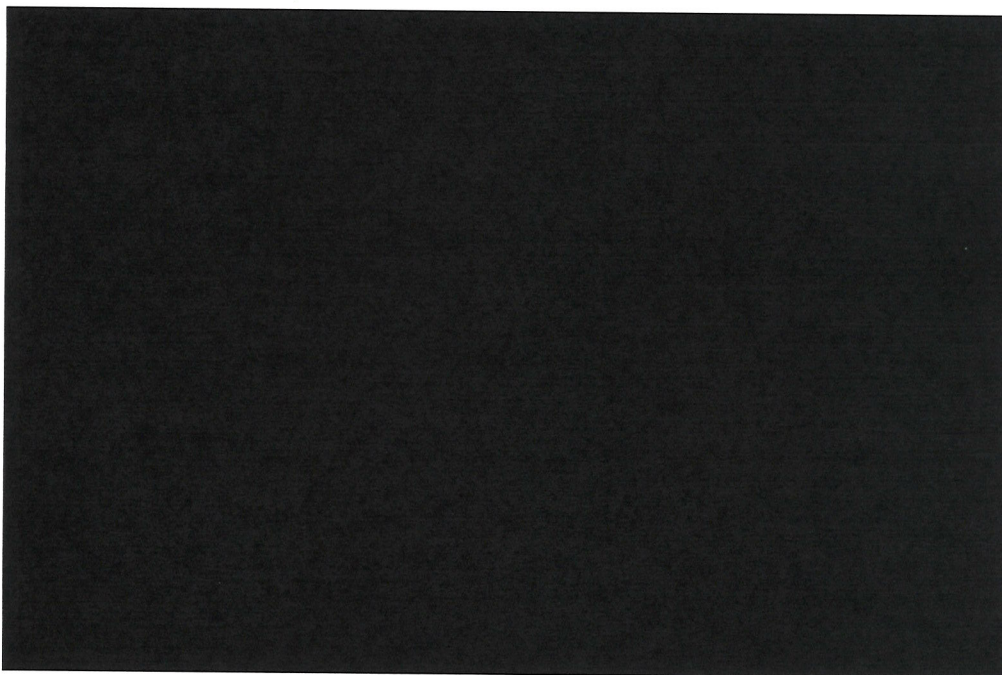

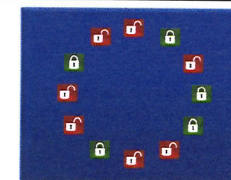


Interoperability



Interoperability requires:

- Similar capacities (strategic)
- Common risk awareness (operational)
- Cooperation & exchange (tactical)



Consequences of Inaction:

- Risk of **coverage** (threats not addressed in a uniform manner)
- Risk of **divergence** (un-harmonized practices)
- Risk of **segmented cooperation** (clusters of cooperation)
