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Subject:	Action file on Afghanistan

In view of the Mocadem Roundtable of 26 September 2025, delegations will find attached the "Action file on Afghanistan".

Introduction / objectives

- Provide protection and support to displaced Afghans (internally and in neighbouring countries), paying particular attention to the most vulnerable populations, in terms of access to basic services and a decent reception;
- Strengthen regional cooperation and dialogue with countries in Afghanistan's immediate neighbourhood (Iran, Pakistan, Central Asia) as well as with countries along the migratory route, such as Türkiye;
- Ensure accurate monitoring of the evolution of migration flows along the entire route;
- Fight against trafficking in human beings and migrant smuggling, irregular migration flows and ensure effective border management, respecting human rights and the principle of *non-refoulement*.
