 2. stipulations for the use of special measures,
 3. the ways and methods of maintaining files,
- d) a report on the activities of the Information Service

Based on Section 5 of the Act no 198/1994 on Military Intelligence Service:

- (2) Members of the Oversight Body shall have the right to enter the sites and facilities of the Military Intelligence Service under the escort of a member of the Military Intelligence Service.
- (3) The minister (of Defence) shall provide the Oversight Body with:
 - a) the statute on the Military Intelligence Service,
 - b) data necessary to examine the utilisation of the limit of the Military Intelligence Service from the budget of the Defence Ministry ,
 - c) internal regulations amending:
 1. the objectives and organizational structure of the Military Intelligence Service,

Committee for the Control of the Use of Electronic Investigative Tools

What is its mandate:

Based on Section 9 of the Act no 166/2003 on Privacy Protection against Illegal Use of Electronic Investigative Tools:

(1) The National Council of the Slovak Republic shall within its exercise its constitutional competence to control observation of laws discuss a report of the committee charged with control of the use of electronic investigative tools on the state of their use in the plenary session twice a year. Each found case of an illegal use of electronic investigative tools, including information about responsible persons based on the section 8, must form a part of the report. The report cannot disclose identity of persons against whom the electronic investigative tools were used or by other means break their privacy rights. The report cannot disclose identity of the person who in conformity with the Act participated at the use of electronic investigative tools.

(4) Members of the Oversight Body shall have the right to enter the protected sites of the state body which has a right to use electronic investigative tools under the escort of a member of the given state body.
