Statewatch is a non-profit-making voluntary group founded in 1991. We are comprised of lawyers, academics, journalists, researchers and community activists. Our European network of contributors is drawn from 18 countries.

25 OBSERV-ATORIES

The Observatories document the development of specific and thematic issues, from **Freedom of Information to Asylum and Immigration**. They bring together draft policies and adopted legislation, analyses from civil society, media reports, critiques and campaigns.

SEARCHABLE DATABASE

Searchable database with all material **since 1991**, including News Online, the Journal & the State Research archive, and the items which accompany them, including **hundreds of leaked EU documents**. This reaches **over 35,000** items, all indexed and keyworded.

EMAIL & SOCIAL MEDIA

In addition to Facebook which has over 1,300 likes and Twitter which has over 5,500 followers, we currently have **more than 9,000** people who have signed up to receive email alerts and are regularly sent information on leading stories and Statewatch activities.



Statewatch staff attend, participate in, speak at, and contribute to **over 20 events** a year all over Europe.



Statewatch maintains a unique online archive of **over 8,400 official EU documents** (1976-2000) charting the development of EU justice and home affairs policy. **Updated weekly**, new documents are constantly being added, each individually indexed and keyworded.

Launched in January 2015, this special observatory covers the **arrival of refugees and asylum seekers**, the reactions and failures of both the EU and its Member States from the beginning of the year. It already has over **500 items and over 2,000 links**, in addition to a daily press alert.



Launched in 2000 and updated daily, **News Online** has articles, reports, documentation and analyses on civil liberties, EU policies and state practices. On average around 25 articles are **published everyday** which include summaries for a regular email digest.



The website has over a million hits a month with over 17,000 different documents downloaded consistently each month.

Updated monthly, the **S**tatewatch **E**uropean **M**onitoring and **Doc**umentation Centre **tracks every measure**, proposed and adopted, in the field of EU justice and home affairs policy since 1993. It contains a legislative observatory of past, current and future JHA measures.

RESEARCH PROJECTS

EU Justicia Network observes EU standards on procedural rights and rights of victims of crime. **NeoConOpticon** monitors the development of the European Security Research Programme. Media analysis of asylum and refugee stories for the **Ethical Journalism Network**.
